

Pleasant Hill Lake is located in Richland and Ashland counties, near Loudonville, Ohio, accessible by St. Rt. 39 or St. Rt. 603 to St. Rt.

History:

Pleasant Hill Dam was constructed in 1938 on the Clear Fork of the Mohican River for the purpose of flood control. The Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District (MWCD) owns the lake and surrounding land, and is responsible for managing conservation and recreational activities. The dam is owned and operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.
