

COON FORK LAKE CAMPGROUND is located on the east side of Coon Fork Lake, and is for use by registered campers and their guests. Camping fees are charged year round. Camping fees are listed on the back. Facilities include: a boat landing (only electric trolling motors are allowed on the lake); sewage dumping station; swimming beach; volleyball court; playgrounds; toilet facilities; water pumps; two shower buildings; hiking trails; nearby mountain bike trails; canoe, paddle and row boat rentals. Showers and flush toilets are not available outside the May 1 to September 15 summer camping season.

CAMPSITES – There are a total of 108 campsites in loops A, B, C and D of which seventy are reservable. There are 6 reservable barrier-free sites with electricity for use by disabled campers, 37 reservable sites with electricity, and 27 reservable sites without electricity. Each campsite is provided with a picnic table, trash bag, fire ring, and bench. Check out time for all campsites is 3:00 p.m.

LOOP D – This loop contains 20 larger campsites for use by self-contained camping units only. A self-contained camping unit is defined as “A camping unit that contains at a minimum a water storage facility and toilet facility that discharges to a liquid waste holding tank that is an integral part of the unit or to a sewage disposal system.” Each site has 50 amp electric service and water hook-ups. Sixteen sites are reservable (includes 9 pull through with one being barrier-free), and 4 non-reservable (includes 1 pull-through).

RESERVATIONS - Applications must be submitted to the Eau Claire County Parks & Forest Department at 227 1st Street West, Altoona WI 54720, and must arrive or be postmarked at least 10 days before the first night of the reservation. Reservations can be made in person or by mail. Telephone reservations are not accepted. The department begins accepting reservations the first workday after Jan. 1 each year. Applications must be on a department reservation form and accompanied by full payment. Reservation forms can be downloaded from the county website at www.co.eau-claire.wi.us and then go to the Parks &

Forest information for Coon Fork. Electric fees will be charged whenever an electrical site is occupied regardless if electricity is used. Reservations are not valid unless confirmed in writing by the Parks & Forest Department.

One person per camping party may submit reservation applications for up to two sites per camping period. A separate application must be submitted for each site, stating name, address, camping unit, etc. for campers at each site. The applicant must be a member of a camping party that will occupy one of the two sites and they must have reservation for their site. A camping party is an individual, family, unorganized group, or juvenile group. A family camping party is parent(s) with their unmarried children and no more than two guests. An unorganized group is a camping party composed of five or fewer persons. A juvenile group is an established organization with at least one adult for every ten juveniles.

Reservations cannot be made for less than two nights. The maximum length of stay is fourteen consecutive nights. The county does not require occupancy at anytime. The Parks & Forest Department reserves the right to change the assignment of sites if necessary. The person to whom the campsite is registered will be held accountable for conduct at their campsite.

There are no refunds for camping or reservations per 16.30.030(E) of the County Code.

VEHICLE ENTRANCE FEES – Vehicle entrance passes are required in all county parks and boat landings. However, up to two vehicles per campsite will be issued a camper courtesy pass for the duration of the paid camping period. All vehicles in the park must have either a camper courtesy pass or entrance pass.

VEHICLES - Only one recreation trailer, motor home, or pickup camper may occupy a campsite. Motor vehicles must be parked on the gravel parking area of

the campsite. No more than two motor vehicles, including the camping unit if a vehicle, are permitted at one campsite. Additional vehicles may be parked in the overflow parking lot by the park office.

BARRIER FREE SITES - Six barrier-free campsites are available for use by disabled persons. These sites are reservable and have electric hookups, elevated fire rings/cooking grates, wheelchair accessible picnic tables, and hard surfacing. These sites will be available for use by people without disabilities only after all other sites are filled. The last two sites may be subject to a one-night stay if a disabled person makes a request by noon of the next day. The last site must then be vacated by 3:00 p.m.

FIREWOOD/POP/ICE - Firewood and ice are sold during posted hours. Pop machines are located by the firewood lot near the campground office.

MOUNTAIN BIKE TRAILS – See the park office for maps of two nearby trails.

SWIMMING BEACHES - Swimming beaches are located on both the east (campground) and west (day use) sides of the lake. Lifeguards are not on duty at these beaches. Swimming will be at your own risk. Children should not be left unsupervised. Swimming and wading is not allowed during an electrical storm or other life-threatening weather, or after dark. Glass containers, grills, or other hot cooking devices are not allowed on either the sand beaches or adjacent grass areas of the beaches.

PETS - Subject to regulations, pets are permitted in the park. Pets must be kept on a leash no longer than eight feet and must be under the owner's control at all times. Please fill in any holes dug by your pets and clean up any droppings. Pets are not allowed on the beach areas (sand or grass), the playground areas, inside any buildings, or in the picnic area on the dayside. Pet owners are expected to keep their pets quiet during campground quiet hours.

RECYCLING - Please assist us by bringing your clean glass, tin, and aluminum to the recycling bins near the park office. Please dispose of your non-recyclable refuse in nearby dumpsters. Please do not leave

refuse bags at your campsite.

QUIET HOURS - Park quiet hours are between 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. Other than registered campers, all visitors must leave the park before 11:00 p.m. Except for cases of emergency, persons or vehicles are discouraged from entering the park between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. Noise from one campsite should not be bothersome to campers trying to sleep at an adjoining campsite. As common courtesy, those interested in “burning the midnight oil” are asked to speak softly and either not play radios at all or only at a low volume.

THE DAYSIDE AREA - Located on the west side of the lake, facilities include: disabled accessible fishing pier; boat landing; two swimming beaches and changing areas; pit toilets; water pump; playground; volleyball court; hiking trails; and picnic shelter. For information on reserving the picnic shelter, call the Parks & Forest Department office at (715) 839-4783.

OTHER REGULATIONS - The speed limit within the park is 10 miles per hour. All roads within the campground are one-way. This also applies to bicycle traffic. All fires are to be kept within the fire rings. It is unlawful to disturb natural growth within the park or surrounding area. It is unlawful to set off any explosive device containing powder or explosive materials within any county park. This includes most kinds of fireworks. Weapons of all kinds are prohibited unless unloaded and enclosed in a carrying case. Park rules and regulations are for the safety of park visitors and enforced by park staff and the Eau Claire County Sheriff's Department.

Reservation Transfer Fee – There will be a \$5.00 fee to transfer your reservation from one date to another, or one site to another.

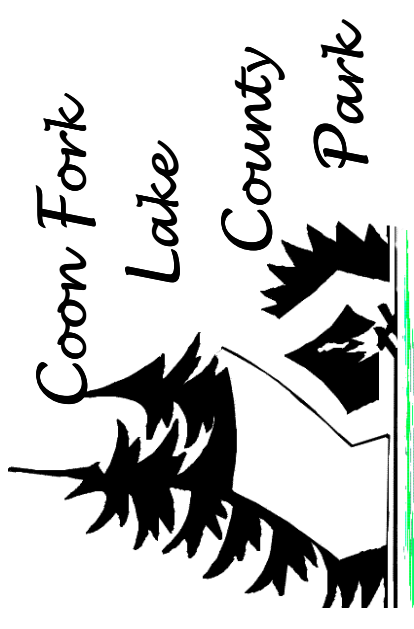
