CAMPGROUND

Our campground rules are based on the Golden Rule of treating others as you would like to be treated. This is your vacation, so have fun! We appreciate your following these important guidelines and going over them with your kids!

Quiet Time: 10:00 pm

to 8:00 am. All campers should return to their site by 10:00 pm. All daily visitors/ guests are required to leave by 10:00 pm. Activities and volume settings must be contained within your campsite during quiet time. Please be aware that normal speaking voices carry. Our quiet hours are strictly enforced.

Check-in/out for campsites and lodging: Check-in is at 2:00 pm each day. If you desire additional time, we may be able to accommodate depending on availability. (Fees apply.) Check at the office please. Check out time is at 12:00 pm.

Garbage: Please place garbage in the Dumpster. We will make every effort to pick it up at your campsite, but we cannot always do this.

Visitors: Facilities in this park are used by registered guests only. Visitors are required to register and pay day use fees at the office before entering the park. Visiting hours are 10:00 am to 8:00 pm. All visitors must leave the park by 10:00 pm. Unless registered as an overnight guest. Please register overnight guests by 8:00 pm in the office.

Waterslide/Playground: The playground and activities are provided at your own risk. We strive hard to follow strict safety guidelines, but due to the rugged nature of outdoor camping, we ask that you inspect all equipment and activities for your safety. Please report any concerns to the office. The activities require staff monitoring when in use. Please do not play on or near equipment after dark or when unstaffed for the safety of you and others. Certain activities require arm bands and/or releases signed by a parent or quardian prior to participation. See the office for schedules and details. All playgrounds close at sunset. Speed Limit: The campground speed limit is 5 MPH. Please protect our children! Drive slowly and watch for kids on bikes. No bicycle riding is permitted after dark. Motorized vehicles must be insured and operated by licensed drivers only.

Camping Equipment: We allow only one RV and one vehicle per site. A small pup tent is allowed for immediate family currently living at the registered guest's home. A maximum limit of people per site applies.

Fires are allowed in fire rings only. Do not leave them unattended. Check at the office for "No fire days."

We love pets when they are leashed and

cleaned up after. They must be accompanied by their master when outside. Pets must not disturb others. so please control their barking or meowing accordingly. No aggressive dogs are allowed.

- Pets are be walked only in a pet walk area or your site. Do not walk pets in another site even if it appears to be empty.
- Clean up after your pet. There is a \$25 fee for any cleanup completed by campground staff.
- Pets are not allowed in any buildings, pool or play areas.
- Pets must be on a 6-foot or shorter leash at all times. Do not leave them unattended.
- Horses are allowed with traveling campers. However, campers with horses must discuss all arrangements with management prior to their arrival. A refundable \$75 cleanup deposit is required.

- Frank W. Williams House (1886): This attractive Victorian house stands today as a lasting memorial to one of Meridian's outstanding citizens.
- **Highland Park** (Built in 1908): This park offers tennis, ball fields, and a swimming pool. Home to the limmie Rodgers Museum ("The Father of Country Music") and the **Dentzel Carousel** in operation since 1909.
- **Peavey Visitors Center** and Museum
- **Dunn's Falls and Carroll Richardson Gristmill**
- Shopping Malls

- Fishing Lakes: Bonita and Okatibbee
- Causeyville General Store[‡] (Opened in 1895): General store and gristmill.
- **Hamasa Shrine Temple** Theater[‡] (Completed in 1928): 2320 8th Street. Moorish-Revival style theater once used for Vaudeville and movies, now used year round for area events, stage shows, plays and concerts.
- Meridian Museum of Art[‡] (Built in 1912): Housed in a Carnegie library.
- **Merrehope Victorian Mansion**[‡] (1858): A 20-room Victorian mansion used as headquarters for Confederate General Leopidas Polk. It was the only home spared by General William T. Sherman when he burned Meridian to the ground during his Civil War rampage.
