
## Welcome!

**Copper Range Campground** is a 17-unit campground without electrical hookups located four-and-one-half miles north of State Highway 2 on County Highway H, then west on Park Road. This campground is popular with anglers in the spring and fall, and located conveniently near favorite fishing holes and canoe routes.

At Copper Range Campground, you will find drinking water from a hand pump near campsite #41. The campground also has a wheelchair accessible site, restrooms, picnic tables, benches, fire grates, a canoe landing, and hiking opportunities nearby on the Historic Bayfield Road Hiking and Snowshoe Trail.

#### **Supplies and Services**

- Showers and a dump station are available for a fee at the Brule River Motel and Campgrounds, located in Brule on State Highway 2.
- Firewood is not provided, but may be purchased from area businesses.
- If you need supplies, a convenience store is located in Brule. There are grocery stores in Poplar and Iron River.



Peaceful and rustic campsites can be found at Copper Range in the great Northwoods.

#### State Parks and Forest Admission Sticker

A State Parks and Forest Admission sticker is **REQUIRED** year-round on vehicles in the campgrounds and at the Bois Brule picnic areas.




This grandfather and grandson team up for some excellent fishing access at Copper Range.

## **Backpack Camping**

- Backpack camping is allowed on the Brule River State Forest provided you hike in with your gear a minimum of one mile from where you park your vehicle, and camp 100 feet off any trail and out of sight of any water body.
- You must possess a Special Camp Registration Permit before heading out to camp. It is free of charge and can be obtained from the Brule River State Forest Station.

- The most popular area for backpack camping is the North Country Trail which provides five backcountry campsites on the State Forest.





#### **Campground Rules**

- All campers must have a campsite reservation **before** occupying the site. Vehicle stickers are **required** for all vehicles.
- Dead and downed wood can be used for firewood. Do not cut any living trees or underbrush.
- Trails may be used to access remote areas of the forest.
   Camping within 100 feet of a trail is prohibited. A permit is required.
- No more than two vehicles may park at a site.

Check out our unique feature – the Percival Copper Pit Mine off the Bayfield Road Hiking Trail.

- No more than six people may occupy a site.
- Closing and visiting hours on the campground is 11:00 p.m.
- Checkout time is 3:00 p.m.
- **DO NOT** leave garbage in the campsite. Refuse containers are located across from campsite #45.
- Fires are permitted in fire rings or charcoal grills in the campsites. DO NOT leave fires unattended and extinguish all fires before leaving. Burning of household refuse is prohibited.
- Pets are allowed in the campsites but are required to be on a leash no longer than eight feet. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets.
